



Summer Program Support Worker

The Autism Resource Centre, a community based, non-profit organization in Regina, offers summer programs for autistic children and youth. The day camp is both goal-oriented and lots of fun! Youth learn life skills and participate in recreational activities throughout the city. All participants are paired one-to-one with a staff member who assists with teaching and ensuring each participant has a safe and positive summer. In this position, you will gain valuable hands-on experience working with neurodiverse youth.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Interest in and/or knowledge of Autism
- Excellent communication skills
- Adaptable and energetic personality to keep up with the campers and the schedule of events
- Ability and willingness to swim; it is a regular part of the schedule, and all staff are expected to participate
- Related experience in the field or working towards/completion of a university degree or college diploma in a related area.

DUTIES

- Carry out the campers' individualized program plans on a one-to-one basis
- Support and participate alongside campers in the daily activities, as planned by directors
- Complete daily communication notes and record goal data consistently
- Attend training sessions and staff meetings; implement strategies taught
- Ensure safety by following the policies and procedures during all program activities; you must also adhere to the ARC confidentiality contract
- Always maintain a high level of professionalism

TERMS

1. Requires a consistent commitment to working from July 3 until August 23, 2024. The workday begins at 8:45 AM and ends at 3:15 PM. Employees must come 15 minutes early for a staff meeting at the start of each work week. Mandatory paid training will be held prior to camp starting (July 3-5). The wage is \$18/hr.
2. A vehicle is an asset to this position. Third party liability insurance and submission of a driver's abstract is required for workers driving in the program. Staff will be reimbursed at a rate of \$0.49/km for mileage.
3. A Criminal Record Check with a Vulnerable Sector search is required and must be submitted before your start date. First Aid and CPR C Certification is recommended.
